## Better Strumming With Dynamics

Before explaining how to use dynamics we should talk quickly about what dynamics are. In general dynamics are small little changes that you make your sturmmig to give it more power, flavor, or groove, and this is done by subtracting or increasing the force used when strumming. Let's look at some examples of how that is used.

Strum Pattern 1 - Use C chord, it is best to learn these ideas with basic harmonies.

1 & 2 & 3 & 4 & C D D D D U

Now we are going to do the same thing but we will emphasize the  $1^{st}$  and  $3^{rd}$  beats and back of the  $2^{nd}$  and  $4^{th}$ .

> if you see < that means that you will need to put an emphases on that note or strum.

Example two - Old faithful

1 & 2 & 3 & 4 & C D D U U D U

Now with this example we can see that not all emphasis will always be on the  $1^{\rm st}$  or  $3^{\rm rd}$  beat, here we will place the emphasis on the  $2^{\rm nd}$  beat to give it a nice country bounce.

Example 3 - Reggae style bounce in 1/16th time.

This strum with no dynamics is BORING! Watch what happens when we add dynamics to the offbeat (this is called syncopation)

Example 4 - Off beat action latin style

```
1 e & a 2 e & a 3 e & a 4 e & a C Am D D D D U D U
```

Because the change is on the offbeat we will empahis that to make it pop.

Lastly I'd like to illustrate how this also works with riffs, lets look at this riff played with no dynamics and than how much of a change it makes by just emphasizing just one note!
