



HOW TO PAINT
**CREAM TABARD &
RED PURITY SEAL**



Today let's find out how to paint the black templar's cream tabard. This technique can also be applied to other lobes or fabrics.

First of all, paint all the parts that will be tabard with GW Base Steel Legion Grab. Don't forget to paint it thinly several times.



Now, after painting the bright parts with GW Base Morghast Bone + GW Base Steel Legion Drab (1:1), glaze the boundary between the two colors.

After this process, it looks like the above. In general, I will highlight and glaze again with Morghast Bone on top of it, but today we will give a texture to match the armor.



Using the stapling technique, use GW Base Morghast Bone + GW Base Steel Legion Drab (1:1) to draw small dots on the entire cape and tabard. Use only Morghast Bone for the brighter part, and use Morghast Bone + Steel Legion Drab (1:2) for the darker part.

Just diluting it very little, use a thin brush to take a dots. It doesn't matter if the brush bends and the size of the dot is uneven. If the number of dots is sufficient, it will hardly be noticeable.



Now, with AK 3rd Pale Sand + GW Base Morghast Bone (1:1), draw small dots on the light-receiving part of the cape and tabard again. If you feel the difference too much from the previously painted part, increase the portion of the Morghast Bone and paint dots to the boundary of the color.



Highlight only the edges and protruding parts of the cape and tabard with AK 3rd Pale Sand + GW Base Morghast Bone (2:1).

The basic tabard is completed. If you want a brighter color, keep stippling while increasing the proportion of the Pale Sand.



Now it's time to paint the red purity seal. Paint the area that will be the purity seal with AK 3rd Burnt Red. After that, paint the side of the purity seal and the boundary between tabard with AK 3rd Burnt Red + AK 3rd Black (1:1).



Next, paint the light-receiving areas where the AK 3rd Scalet Red. Don't forget to paint it thin several times. After that, glaze the boundary between the two colors with AK 3rd Sclaet Red + AK 3rd Burnt Red (1:1).

After this process, it becomes the same as above.



Now, highlight the edge of the purity seal with AK 3rd Scale Red + AK 3rd Pale Sand (2:1). If you don't like the feeling of pink, glaze with red ink or Scalet Red after highlighting.



Now paint the letters of Purity Seal with AK 3rd Silver Grey. In this case, I recommended to slightly coat the tip of a thin brush with undiluted paint. If you need to draw such a thin line, draw a thin line on the back of your hand and collect the brush tips before painting it on the actual model.

When drawing letters, it is more natural that there is a slight curve or cut in the middle rather than a complete straight line.



It's done!
